
# MERCY'S PRESIDENT



- Mary led by example not only for me, but for the entire student body she showed us how to shine our light no matter what challenge would come our way.



### Larry Teevens





### Office of Mission & Ministry

The Office of Mission & Ministry, previously recognized as Campus Ministry, was established this academic school year as a result of feedback from our strategic planning efforts. The Office of Mission & Ministry will be represented at Board of Trustees meetings, the President's Cabinet, and Mercy administrator planning sessions. ### Mercy High School Makes History: 2023-24 Theater Season Debuts World Premiere of Michigan-Authored Play and Disney's *Frozen*

Groundbreaking theatrical productions celebrating the power of sisterhood with the debut of Angels of Bataan followed by the Michigan high school debut of "Disney's Frozen: The Broadway Musical" in March 2024.



Mercy Performing Arts Department has once again proven its commitment to advancing the arts while championing strong female narratives. Mercy High School is the first to stage two works that embody the spirit of sisterhood: *Angels of Bataan*, a new drama penned by a local Michigan author debuted in October 2023, followed by the first high school staging of *Disney's Frozen: The Broadway Musical* in the state of Michigan this March 2024.

"I really wanted to find stories that spoke to sisterhood because it aligned so well with our values at Mercy," said Shelley Bajorek, Chair of Mercy High School's Performing Arts Department. "Both plays delve into the intricacies of relationships among women. They are obviously very different stories, but the common thread is the celebration of unity and the undeniable strength found in between sisters. Angels, is a story of perseverance and resilience during wartime. *Frozen* showcases a princess who counts on the love of her sister instead of needing to be saved by a prince."

"We are incredibly proud to be the sole school in the state to have won a nationwide United States of Frozen contest granting us the rights to stage this beloved show. To be able to produce this show in a season where we will also have a world-premier event of a local playwright highlights our excellence and innovation in the arts," said President Dr. Cheryl Delaney Kreger '66

### Reenacting WWII in Angels of Bataan

Angels of Bataan, written by local Michigan author Tracy Wells, tells the true story of female Army nurses who were prisoners of war during World War II.

"What intrigued me was telling the story of female heroes. I wanted to tell a story about healing and how friends - and importantly - these sisters, were put in extraordinary circumstances and how they endured," said Wells. "I didn't want to tell a story about tragedy, but of resilience. These women came to what they thought would be a vacation and became nurses in war and ultimately, POWs. I loved having a chance to tell a story about amazing women for a group of amazing young women to try."

Ms. Wells has written other works that have been staged by schools around the country, but she allowed Mercy to be the first to sign *Angels of Bataan*, giving them the world premiere of this production, making this class the original cast.

"I loved that Mercy was exploring the theme of sisterhood. This story tells the story not only of actual sisters, but of the sisterhood of nurses. Trauma bonds you in a way that nothing else does, as we learned so acutely during the pandemic," said Wells.

In line with the school's tradition of community engagement, special events were organized around both productions. Student actors met with the author to learn more about her vision for the drama and held workshops with war veterans and local nurses.



"This is an educational experience for the cast as well. We want the students to gain as much insight to what these women endured as possible. Having our actors learn from lived experiences has been an invaluable asset to their ability to fully tell this story," said Bajorek.

### Debuting Michigan's First Performance of Disney's Frozen

In the summer of 2022, Ms. Bajorek and the Performing Arts team, along with high school directors around the country, competed in the United States of Frozen: Love Is An Open Door contest. Sponsored by the Educational Theatre Association, Music Theater International, and Disney Theatrical Group, the competition granted one high school in every state or territory across the country the right to produce the musical. Mercy High School learned they won the contest in September 2022 and began fundraising immediately for additional tools for the production.

As a part of the contest, all high schools were asked to describe their vision for the musical and how they emulate the theme, "Love is an open door." "We felt like 'Love is an open door' theme highlighted who we are at Mercy. Our Theater department is such a welcoming place, and there is always an open door for students who want to try something new and exciting. In our application, we highlighted how we would use the critical concerns of the Sisters of Mercy in our production: Women, Non-Violence, Anti-Racism, Immigration, and Earth. All of these concerns can be connected to the story of *Frozen*. Overall, it is an opportunity for us to exercise our Core Values that are so clearly seen in this story - like Educational Courage, A Voice for Dignity and Respect, and Principled Leadership," Bajorek explained.

Auditions for the musical were held in early September and the cast and crew with over 100 high school and middle school students from around the metro Detroit area has already been chosen.

"There is just something magical about high school theater. We teach our actors to dive into the psychology of each character to understand what makes them act the way they do. It's an amazing journey of discovery. And for our students, these are more than performances; they are platforms that empower our young women at a pivotal phase in their lives to find and amplify their voices, ultimately enabling them to navigate the nuances of sisterhood and womanhood," said Bajorek.

# Campbell Flynn sets off to new levels

ampbell Flynn, junior setter at Mercy High School, spent her summer busy competing on the United States Womens U19 and U21 volleyball teams at the 2023 World Championships in Croatia and Mexico.

Flynn went to National Team Development Programs in the winter of 2022 and the summer of 2023. The coaches of the various United States teams scouted her at club tournaments and saw her potential. She was chosen to train for the team in Colorado this past summer, competing with 20 others girls for a spot on the final roster of 12. After her week of training in Colorado, she was chosen for the final roster of the U19 womens team. The U19 Women's team would travel to Croatia in early August, 2023 to compete in the U19 World Championships. Flynn won gold, along with the rest of the U19 women, after going undefeated in the tournament.

"It was crazy, it felt unreal," junior Campbell Flynn said. "It was so much fun and I met so many cool people from across the country that I'm really close with now."

When you make the final roster for the U19 team, you automatically make the roster for the U.S. Women's U21 team. After winning gold in Croatia, flynn flew back to the United States where she spent a week in California to recover while her fellow teammates that she would play alongside in Mexico flew in. Flynn and the rest of the U21 team went to Mexico in late August where they placed 6th at the U21 World Championships.

"Winning was amazing but also getting sixth at U21's was

crazy because we were such a young team," Flynn said.

On June 16th, 2023, Flynn committed to play at University of Nebraska on the women's volleyball team, the top ranked program in the country.

"I always wanted to play at Nebraska and it was my dream," Flynn said. "They have been following me for a long time and I love their coaching staff and volleyball is super big at Nebraska."

But the end of the summer does not bring an end to Flynni's season, actually it's quite the opposite because high school

season has only just begun.

Flynn has been a starting setter on varsity since freshman year and is looking forward to her third season playing for Mercy. Previously, MVV lost in the State Championship Tournament in Regional Round 1 against Northville but Flynn has high hopes for the season.

"I'm very excited to play this high school season and I think we can go far in the tournament," Flynn said. "I haven't really met the freshman or the newcomers so I'm excited to get to know them."

The Mercy Varsity Volleyball Head Coach Loretta Vogel has been impressed with Flynn's ability as the setter and as team leader on the court since freshman year.

"I think from the time she was a freshman, she was able to run the offense and be very mature about that, and I think for anyone in a program setting is such an important aspect of the game," Vogel said. "So, we've been very fortunate that from the time she was a freshman, she was able to step into that role."

Angie Butler, senior on the MVV team and 2 year teammate of Flynn, also recognizes the effect Flynn has on the

In addition to her national teams, Flynn competes for her club team, Legacy 17-1 Adidas. With all of Flynn's competiton and her collegiate season coming soon, one can only wonder what is in store for the rest of her volleyball career.

# Chevallier jumps over the competition

fter losing the desire to run long distance, an unexpected opportunity to attempt high jumping, ultimately led to 2 state championships and 1st place at the 2023 Junior Olympics for senior Milena Chevallier.

After running long distance during her entire freshman year, Chevallier saw a high jumper from Vanderbilt's women Track and Field team that led her to gain interest in the idea of doing field events herself. Even though Chevallier had only attempted high jump once 2 weeks before the qualifiers, her club team and Mercy Track Coach Michael Montijo allowed her to try to qualify for the 2022 Junior Olympic in high jump. To the surprise of many, she qualified and ended up coming in 6th place, leading to the beginning of her high jump career sophomore year.

"To be honest I really hated running," Chevallier said. "So I ended up deciding I don't want to do this anymore and I ended up high jumping instead which has worked out."

Since Chevallier began high jumping, she has made unbelievable accomplishments. She won her first state championship at the MITS Indoor State championships earlier this year. She also qualified for States for the second year on Mercy's Varsity Track and Field team. She jumped 5 feet 11 inches, winning her second state championship and clinching the girls high school state record at the 2023 MHSAA LP Division 1 Track and Field Finals at the end of this past school year. Going into the summer already leaping over records, she continued her success at the Nike Nationals in Oregon where she placed 2nd. Later at the Under 20s National Championship, where she competed against college

athletes and in front of college coaches and came in 4th. Regardless of everything she achieved this summer, the most cherished victory was jumping 5 feet 10 inches, winning first place at the 2023 Junior Olympics National Championship in August.

"There's a lot to say about Milena, but it is hard to describe greatness in the making," Montijo said.

Despite the amount of success Chevallier has accomplished, she still faces challenges such as the high expectations and pressures of an athlete of her caliber to consistently perform at a high level. After an outstanding sophomore season, Chevallier qualified for States and was seeded at or predicted to be state champion. After having what Chevallier described as "one of the most disappointing performances in her career" and getting fifth place, she was forced to go back and reevaluate her training to prepare for what she hoped to be a higher place at states the next year.

"After a disappointing finish at fifth I thought to myself, oh I need to go back and work 20x harder," Chevallier said. "If I want to reach my goal, I need to get more consistent."

Although she did not perform at the level she wanted to her sophomore year, she came back stronger than before her junior year. She came in seeded as number 2 and ultimately won states, achieving "redemption".

"Getting 1st place was a big improvement," Chevallier said. "It was really rewarding getting to see a year of hard work pay off."

Milena's undeniable talent and humbleness when it comes to high jumping are qualities that everyone around her respects.

"I can tell you that Milena has the it factor," Montijo said

"She has social grace, courage, composure, a kind heart, intelligence (both emotional and intellectual), and possesses a form of quiet leadership that her teammates and I as her coach respect."

Regardless of the accomplishments Chevallier has already reached she still has many goals that she and her coach plan to achieve in the upcoming years. In regards to college, she hopes to commit to a D1 school by the end of November with a full ride scholarship. She also plans to jump 6 feet, a personal record, and take part in the 2024 Olympic trials next year. As for long term goals, Chevallier dreams of participating in the 2028 Olympics in Los Angeles where she aims to find herself standing on the podium holding a medal between her teeth.

"My coaching objective is to guide Milena through her Olympic development journey, which can reasonably materialize for the 2024 Olympic Trial," Montijo said.

### 2023 Trailblazer Alumna Award ERIN KEITH '09



Erin Keith '09 graduated summa cum laude from Howard University in 2013 with her B.A. in Political Science and from Georgetown Law with her J.D. in 2016 and LLM in 2018. She is a member of the State Bar of Michigan and the District of Columbia Bar.

Erin currently serves as Managing Policy Counsel for the Detroit Justice Center (DJC). In this capacity, she leads the organization's policy strategy and analyzes legislation to remove legal barriers in the criminal legal system. Erin has worked on critical issues, including cash bail reform, eliminating excessive fines and fees, driver's license reinstatement and traffic law reform, police accountability, and divesting from carceral structures to fund community reinvestment.

Erin first joined DJC during its founding year, 2018, as its Youth Empowerment Attorney. In this role, she worked to provide legal services with an emphasis on those under 25 and leading the development of DJC's Know Your Rights workshops and other outreach programming for local students.

Erin then shifted roles to serve as a Staff Attorney in the Legal Services and Advocacy Practice (LSAP) at DJC. In this role, she focused on criminal legal system reform through a racial equity lens, by providing direct representation to indigent and/or formerly incarcerated clients.

Observing countless inequities in Michigan's traffic courts, Erin spearheaded the creation of and co-authored the "Highway Robbery Report," a 60-page white paper on transit apartheid, racialized policing and wealth extraction through municipal traffic courts. In addition to representing clients in hundreds of misdemeanor matters, resulting in a substantial reduction or complete waiver of fines and fees for each individual and the prevention of subsequent jail time in each case, Erin also aided returning citizen clients in child support debt and child custody proceedings, resulting in forgiveness of substantial arrearages, and restored custodial rights.

Before joining the Detroit Justice Center team, Erin served as the Juvenile Defense and Policy Fellow for Georgetown's Juvenile Justice Initiative. Erin has also served as a judicial intern for a juvenile judge in D.C. Superior Court and as a Summer Associate for Miller, Canfield, Paddock, and Stone, P.L.C. In 2016, Erin published two academic articles in the Harvard Journal of African American Public Policy, and in the Georgetown Journal of Law and Modern Critical Race Perspectives. Erin has gone on to share her political commentary and/or written editorials on various outlets, including CNN, NPR, USA Today, WDET, and the Detroit Free Press and was recently awarded the NAACP Great Expectation Award at the NAACP Detroit annual Fight for Freedom fund dinner.

### 2023 President's Award for Transformational Leadership MEG MALLON '81




Margaret "Meg" Mallon '81 is this year's recipient of the President's Award for Transformational Leadership. A natural leader throughout her life, she is loved by everyone who meets her.

Meg started playing golf at the age of seven and was on the first golf team at Mercy. After high school, Meg attended Ohio State University where she earned All-Conference honors in 1984 and 1985 and was the runner-up at the 1985 Big Ten Championship. She joined the LPGA tour in 1987 and had a breakout year in 1991 winning four times including two majors as well as being named Female Player of the Year. During her professional golf career, which extended until 2010, Meg won a total of 18 LPGA tour events, four of which were major championships in addition to representing the United States in eight Solheim Cup events. During the LPGA's 50th Anniversary celebration in 2000, Mallon was named one of the top-50 players and teachers. Meg was elected to the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame in 2008 and inducted in 2010. She was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2017.

Meg is philanthropic and continues to support Mercy. Throughout her prestigious LPGA career, Meg lent her name to Mercy's Golf Outing. She and her family also established, and annually support, the Meg Mallon Scholarship, an endowment that helps the tuition needs of students into perpetuity.

### DONOR ADVISED FUND

Some families are choosing to create a Donor Advised Fund, a kind of charitable investment account. If you have a Donor Advised Fund, please consider giving a gift - perhaps even a recurring yearly gift - to Mercy High School.

### NAMED ENDOWMENT

Mercy's Endowment provides tuition assistance to students in financial need. Endowments may be named in honor or memory of a family member; \$25,000 is needed to establish an Endowment. A named Endowment is a legacy gift that ensures long-term financial stability and helps keep tuition affordable.
