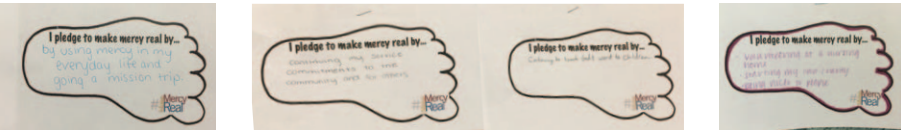

How gifted we are to be named Mercy during this extraordinary 2016 Jubilee Year of Mercy as declared by Pope Francis, “What moved Jesus...was nothing other than mercy, with which he read the hearts of those he encountered and responded to their deepest need.”

Throughout the year, the Mercy Mission Committee held school-wide activities to commemorate this Year of Mercy and to #MakeMercyReal. An Alternative to Spring Break

Mercy students have been making the trip to Kentucky for alternative spring break since 1997. The girls work with Habitat for Humanity, a Christian organization that provides housing to low-income families across the nation. “It gives [Mercy students] the opportunity to see how people less fortunate live, and to give back,” said pastoral minister and trip chaperone Mrs. Judi Dennis. “Habitat is God-centered and their values match Mercy values.”

The type of work varies from year to year, depending on what needs to be done. In previous years, students have been the first group to start on the house. This year, however, the girls were the last group to work on the home and completed molding, painting, insulation and landscaping work. Being the last group meant that the girls got a chance to meet the homeowner at the end of the week.

“You can’t put a value on what you’re giving and what you get out of it,” said Mrs. Dennis. “We met the homeowner on Friday, a woman in her early fifties, who never owned a home. She was so excited!”

“It was definitely an impactful experience,” said Kaitlyn Brown. “I was able to bond with the girls who went, and I learned really awesome things on the work site. Most of all, I left knowing that the work we did in one week changed a woman’s life... I am blessed to have been able to take part in it.”

The entire Mercy community gets involved with alternative spring break. Monetary and food donations from Student Council and the Mothers and Dads Clubs, along with gardening tools from students and seeds from the McDowell family, made the trip possible. Over the years, a number of teachers and parents have taken the trek to Kentucky along with the students. Mrs. Dennis looks forward to it each year, calling it a “different way of way of worshipping and praising God.”

ROBOTICS COMPETES AT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS!



The Mercy High School Robotics Team (The Riveters) competed at the FIRST World Championships held April 27-April 30 in St. Louis, MO. With a robot designed and built by the students the team placed 48th out of 75 teams on the Carver Field. They finished in the top 12% of all robotics teams worldwide. The robot’s unique climbing mechanism was ranked in the top 3% worldwide in points achieved. At the state championship qualifiers, The Riveters were awarded the Jack Kamen Imagery Award, which recognizes them as the number 1 team for Imagery in the State of Michigan. The Riveters were the highest placing all-girls high school in the state of Michigan!

NATIONAL SCHOLASTIC ART AWARD WINNERS

Mercy High School seniors Miranda Stano, Jinghan (Molane) Hu and their teacher, Ms. Susan Smith '84, have earned national recognition in the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards of 2016. Miranda won a gold medal and an American Visions Medal for her drawing titled "Grandmother." Jinghan (Molane) won a silver medal for her drawing titled "My Grandmother" and a silver medal for her portfolio titled "People In My Eyes." These students have been identified by panels of creative professionals as the most talented young artists in the nation. This year, nearly 320,000 works of art and writing were submitted. Only the top 1% were recognized at the national level.

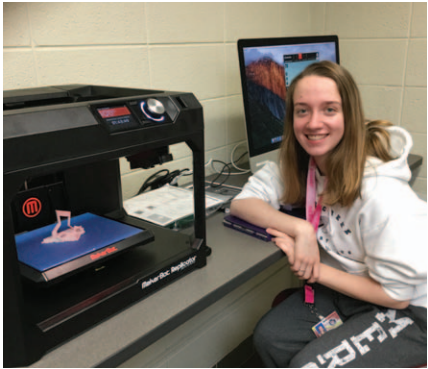

SOMMER WOODS '95 RECEIVES 2016 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNA AWARD

Mercy High School congratulates Sommer Woods '95, recipient of the 2016 Distinguished Alumna Award. Sommer is Vice President of External Relations and Marketing for M-1 Rail, a light rail circulator (QLINE) designed to strengthen the backbone of the Detroit region. Her responsibilities include workforce development, community engagement/inclusion, governmental relations, and minority/Detroit based business procurement. A colleague wrote, "In this role, she has been instrumental in ensuring that minority and women-owned businesses are given an opportunity to participate in and benefit from the business opportunities associated with the development of Detroit."

Sommer has an impressive background in public relations and large-scale special events management, as demonstrated in her roles with former Detroit mayor Dave Bing's Administration, the PGA TOUR, and the Super Bowl XL Host Committee. She serves as Detroit City Council's appointee to the Belle Isle Advisory Committee and serves on the board of Tour de Troit. Sommer has accomplished many career goals but considers being a mentor her greatest achievement, most notably with the Midnight Golf Program for youth development. Sommer and her mother Jacci Woods created a scholarship fund honoring her college golf coach. Each year they award deserving Midnight Golf students who will attend a historically black college or university. Sommer holds a bachelor's degree in business from Talladega College and is a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority.

The Class of 1995 elected Sommer Senior Class President. To this day, Sommer continues her service to Mercy High School. Most recently, she shared her insight with the student club B.A.S.E. (Black Awareness Society for Education) and encouraged class participation in Mercy's 70th Anniversary and Grand Reunion Celebration. To the Mercy Administration,

I graduated from Mercy in 2005 - I know that there have been many changes since then. There are new staff, new uniform guidelines, new classes, and certainly new technology. But I am both hopeful and confident that the spirit of Mercy is the same as it always has been. What is the spirit of Mercy High School? In my eyes, it is one that is gentle yet powerful, encouraging and persistent, faith-filled and compassionate.

Being a student at Mercy taught me that women can be leaders, athletes, scientists, writers, artists. Mercy taught me to be accepting of everyone, and to lift up our peers rather than drag them down. When I struggled in math class, Mrs. Kowalski gently guided me. When I was lost and needed a place to belong, Mrs. MacLennan and the pastoral team welcomed me with open arms. When I discovered my love for writing and became hungry for more, Ms. Desmond and Mr. Schusterbauer challenged me. When I was shy and eager to break out of my shell, Mrs. Rozman taught me the importance of just being me.

Because of my experience at Mercy, I went on to become a member of the Mercy Volunteer Corps and an Associate of the Sisters of Mercy. My goal is to spread the message of Catherine McAuley and of Mercy. Thank you for giving me something to be proud of, thank you for giving me a gift that I will cherish for the rest of my life.

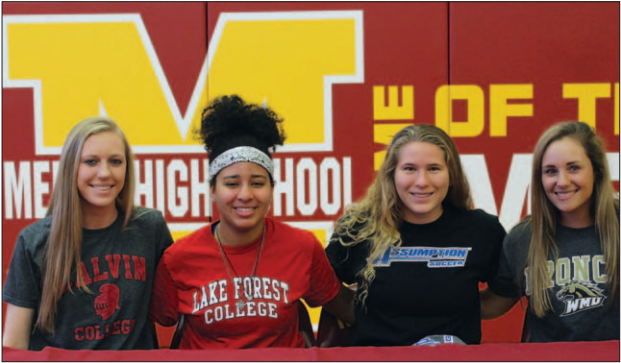

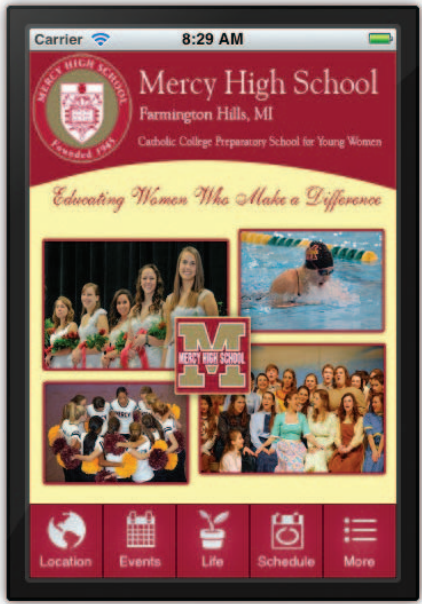
