## Mercy Mission

Mercy High School, a Catholic college preparatory school immersed in the tradition of the Sisters of Mercy, educates and inspires young women of diverse backgrounds to lead and serve with compassion.

## The Mercy Community

Mercy High School was founded in 1945 when the Sisters of Mercy opened Our Lady of Mercy High School in Detroit. In 1965, Mercy High School moved to its present location, a 25 acre campus in Farmington Hills, a suburb of Detroit. The student body is comprised of young women from over 60 metropolitan Detroit communities, giving Mercy a rich, multi-ethnic constituency from diverse, socio-economic backgrounds. Current Mercy Enrollment 9-12: 652; 29% of students identify as BIPOC; 66% of students are Catholic; 29% of students receiving gift aid.

Recognized nationally as an Exemplary Private High School by the United States Department of Education, Mercy has been accredited by AdvanceEd. Mercy has also been recognized by Apple as a distinguished school for innovation, leadership and educational excellence.

## Covid-19 Response

### 2020-2021 Year

Mercy High School utilized a hybrid model of instruction for a majority of the school year. Students received in-person instruction two days per week and live-streamed remote instruction 3 days per week. Attendance was expected as if a typical school day. Students could choose to learn in a 100% virtual environment through our GOAL program. Students earned letter grades for coursework. Mercy returned to in-person instruction for all hybrid students March 2021.

### 2021-2022 Year

Mercy High School returned to in-person instruction for all students. Masks are mandated to be worn in the building by all students and staff. Students who test positive for COVID or experience at-risk exposure, are expected to stay home on quarantine for 2 weeks, otherwise regular attendance is expected. COVID-19 data for staff and students is updated and shared weekly.



## The Class of 2022

The Mercy Class of 2022 is comprised of 173 students representing 43 communities. It includes: 7 AP Scholars, 2 National Hispanic Recognition Program students and 1 National Indigenous Recognition Program student.

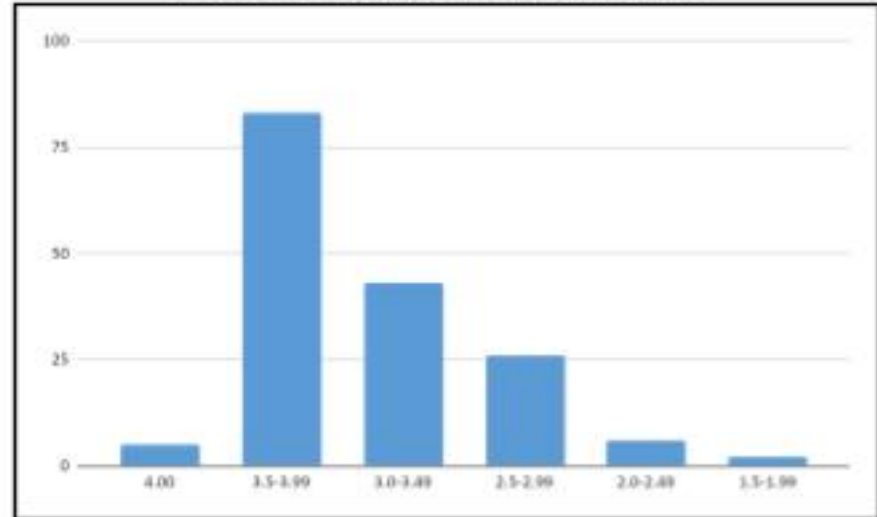
#### ACT Composite Scores: 2020-2021

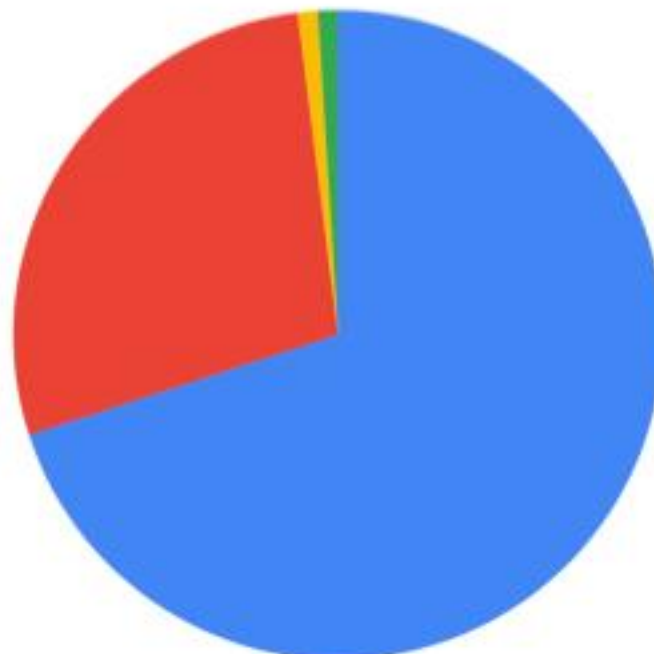

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS COURSES

Students typically begin AP courses in the junior year. Placement in first-year Honors Courses is determined by the Mercy High School Placement Test and individual family conversations. Students are free to enroll in any Honors or AP course and receive guidance from their teachers and school counselors. In the 2021-2022 school year, 311 AP exams were administered. 33% received a 3, 23% received a 4, and 12% received a 5.
