PREAMBLE

Born Mary Brown on Christmas Day 1953, she was the oldest child of Bob and Adele Brown and a great example for her younger sisters Nancy, Judy and Carrie and her brother Michael.

Mary attended high school in Mayfield, Ohio and frequently shared stories of those years. Those stories often included her high school best friend, Anita and how they spent many simple, but memorable times together growing up.

Mary graduated from John Carroll University and received her Master's degree from Ohio State University in Biology. Mary spent many years working in the medical field, which included research working with monkeys while at OSU and later working in cardiology.

In addition to her duties as a mother of three, she spent much of her time in volunteer positions as a home room mom, cub scout and girl scout leader, sports team manager, volunteering in many capacities at church, senior citizen's home, nursing homes, Meals on Wheels, helping at soup kitchens and in various other civic and community service programs.

A friend too many, Mary always had a comment, frequently talking to anyone who would listen and even those who did not listen. In many ways, Mary was a bit "unconventional", which is what endeared her to all that knew her.

While she was called to heaven too early, The Mary Gregory Memorial Scholarship Foundation was established in her memory to promote and honor high school girls who possess many of the characteristics she exhibited; bright, energetic, a friend to peers and her elders, and a willingness to help anyone in need of help.

While she is dearly missed by her family and friends, the Foundation will touch many, to help them educationally, as they work towards becoming the female leaders of tomorrow.

In the words of Ralph Waldo Emerson, **"To laugh often and much; To win the respect of intelligent people and the affection of children; To earn the appreciation of honest critics and endure the betrayal of false friends; To appreciate beauty, to find the best in others; To leave the world a bit better, whether by a healthy child, a garden patch or a redeemed social condition; To know even one life has breathed easier because you have lived, this is to have succeeded."**

In the words of Emerson, Mary not only succeeded, but flourished. With the above explanation and understanding as a basis of measurement, applicants will be evaluated on the criteria in the application.

Step 1 BE SURE TO TEAR OFF AND KEEP THIS PORTION OF THE APPLICATION

Background

The Mary Gregory Memorial Scholarship Foundation (TMGMSF), a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, was formed to find and support female individuals, driven by a passion to reach out to those in need and help them in their needs.

With primary education being of extreme importance in developing young minds and the cost of that education increasing, TMGMSF will provide scholarships to deserving high school juniors and seniors who have proven academically and through community service, to be exemplary in developing themselves and in helping others. The TMGMSF scholarship program seeks to invest in those who are exemplary role models in their community and who have the initiative to fulfill their educational and community service goals.

TMGMSF's goal is simple: to identify and invest in future female leaders.

Eligibility

Currently enrolled high school sophomore and juniors who attend, or who will attend, a high school with a college preparatory curriculum. Applicants must be legal U.S. residents, be less than 18 years of age, have a minimum 2.7 GPA and attend a high school which requires payment of tuition.

Application requirements

-Eligible students must submit a complete application and attach all of the required documentation, or their application will not be reviewed.

-Applications must be postmarked no later than April 15, 2019 to be eligible for consideration. Applications postmarked after April 15, 2019, will NOT be reviewed.

Scholarship terms and conditions

At a minimum TMGMSF will award a scholarship with a value of \$1,000, with the potential of awarding up to five such scholarships for the 2018-19 school year. At the discretion of the Foundation committee, the amount and number of scholarships can increase. Applicants can

Scholarship recipients must enroll in and attend a college preparatory high school in the academic year following their selection. Verification of enrollment is required. Scholarship funds will be paid via check, directly to the high school in which the student enrolls. Scholarship funds will not be paid directly, nor reimbursed, to an award recipient.

Scholarship funds will be applied toward tuition, fees and other appropriate educational expenses, as determined by TMGMSF.

Supporting documents

Transcript, Letters of Recommendation and Personal Statement

-A certified high school transcript that contains the student's class rank and GPA. Applicant must carry a minimum 2.7 GPA.

-A one page letter of recommendation from one of the applicant's teachers, or a school official is required. The letter should detail the applicant's background, achievements, leadership abilities and community involvement. Letters should contain personalized information about the applicant. Form letters will be given minimal consideration.

-A one page letter of recommendation from a special friend, of how the applicant's relationship with the friend, has helped her in school, or in life.

-A list of volunteer activities participated in for the last 2 years WITHOUT PAY, which includes a statement of the impact this work made, both on the applicant and the organization, and the total hours spent for each activity.

-Applicants must submit a personal statement that provides information about their background, career goals and desire to contribute to their community. Information about unique, personal or financial circumstances may be added. Personal statements must not be more than two pages long.
